Mr. Brownlow felt pity for the boy and carried him to his home. In the peaceful atmosphere of the house, Oliver recovered.

One evening, he was forced to help Bill Sikes and Toby Crackit break into a house. They pushed the boy in through the window and told him to open the door.

7	Mrs. Maylie and Rose took him in and nursed him back to strength. They liked Oliver and gave him the love he had always dreamed of. Oliver finally found out that his mother's name was Agnes Fleming and Rose was his real aunt. Monks, who wanted to ruin his life, was the first son of Oliver's father and wanted to get all his money. Mr Brownlow adopted Oliver and he could put his old life behind him forever.
